- Parkfield Primary School is a one form entry primary school situated in an area of Wolverhampton with a high level of deprivation. We have a total number of 212 pupils on roll.
- The school is in the top 20% of all schools for the proportion of children eligible for FSM/ever 6 (51% compared with 24% nationally). The percentage of FSM in Year 6 (63%) was higher than all other year groups.
- There were no looked after children.
- The school was in the top 20% of all schools for the proportion of EAL pupils (48.3% compared with 21% nationally.) This school has 12 out of 17 possible ethnic groups. The average number of groups for this phase of education is 9.
- The proportion of pupils with SEN support is above national (26.5% compared with 12.2% nationally). The proportion of pupils with an EHCP is broadly in line with the national picture (1% compared with 1.3% nationally). We currently have 3 children confirmed and 2 pending.
- Family educational experiences and visits to museums, places of interest are extremely rare for many of our PPG pupils.
- Poor attendance is a barrier to learning for many pupils.
- Many of our PPG children also have additional needs (29% of our PPG are also on the school's SEND register)
